Back to School Anxiety

A new school year can trigger both excitement and stress for students. Will my new teacher like me? How much homework will I have? Will I fit in? Most of these worries are natural. However, if a child exhibits a change in appetite, insomnia, self-isolation, excessive crying, or emotional outbursts, he or she may be experiencing an unusual amount of anxiety. Educators can help these students by:

- Normalizing discomfort—Ensure that these fears are normal and experienced by others, even teachers.
- **Encourage open communication**—Allow children to talk about their fears and express specific concerns.
- Familiarize the experience—Provide opportunities for students to visit their new classrooms and teachers.
- **Provide a welcoming classroom**—Establish clear routines, plan frequent breaks, play relaxing music, give advance notice of changes, etc.
- Make connections—Visit students at home to welcome them.

Prescription opioid abuse is an evolving epidemic and impacts rural and urban counties in PA.

Pennsylvania Opioid Epidemic

- PA had the 6th highest rate of opioid overdose deaths in the US in 2015. ("Drug Overdose Death Data." Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. 16 December 2016)
- PA was 1 of only 8 states with a statistically significant increase in drug overdose deaths from 2013 to 2014 and from 2014 to 2015. (Rudd RA, Seth P, David F, Scholl L. "Increases in Drug and Opioid-Involved Overdose Deaths — United States, 2010–2015." Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report. 2016)
- ◆ The National Survey on Drug Use and Health discovered a slight downward trend from 2011 to 2014 in self-reported prescription opioid misuse among 12 to 17 year olds in Pennsylvania.
- ◆ A 2015 Pennsylvania Youth Survey (PAYS) found the following for grades 6-12:
 - 2 percent of youth in Lehigh County indicated 30-day prescription opioid misuse, which is 1 percent below the average rate of 3 percent for all counties
 - Perceptions and attitudes toward prescription drug misuse showed "a declining sense of risk and fewer normative constraints towards misuse."
 - 72% of youth in Lehigh county reported a below average perceived risk of prescription drug misuse; the statewide rate was 82%.
 - The ease of access to prescription drugs increased slightly between 2013 and 2015.
 - 37.0% took prescription drugs without permission and 37.5% received them in Northeast Pennsylvania (Susquehanna, Wyoming, Wayne, Lackawanna, Pike, Luzerne, Monroe, Carbon, Northampton, and Lehigh)
 - The ease of acquiring prescription drugs (reported as 'sort of easy' or 'very easy') in Lehigh County (17%) was below the state average of 27%.

Look over your SAP documents:

- ◆ Is all the information accurate and up-to-date?
- ♦ Is the language parent- and student-friendly?

Revisit your referral process:

- Are referral forms easily accessible to staff, parents, and students?
- Is there a secure way to anonymously submit paper referrals? Electronic referrals?

Review your 2016-17 SAP Effectiveness Checklist Recommendations:

- What goals does your team want to set for this school year?
- ♦ How do you want to improve your process?

Examine your SAP data from previous years:

- ♦ What trends can you identify?
- ♦ What populations do you serve?
- What are the outcomes of your referrals?

Diversify the SAP team:

- Are all groups in the school staff represented?
- ♦ Have you scheduled SAP training for new members?

Inform faculty and staff about the SAP team and how to make referrals:

- Do all faculty and staff know how to make SAP referrals?
- ♦ Have you booked a faculty presentation with your SAP Liaison?

Notify families and students about SAP and how to make referrals:

- ◆ Have you arranged for a SAP information table for Open House, Meet The Teacher, conferences, or orientations?
- ◆ Does your SAP Liaison know the dates?

Schedule your Team Maintenance now:

• Have you thought about a team maintenance workshop? It can help fine tune your team's working dynamics, build on your


